Every year we hold one sponsored event. As explained in a previous email we have moved it from April to October. This year we are tying it in with Book Week and our drive to boost home learning.

The children have been given a sponsor form. They have been told that they must not ask people to sponsor them without your permission. Family, neighbours, family friends, your work colleagues, please help your children get sponsors. And your children could even show their thanks by reading to their sponsors.

The sponsors can decide whether to sponsor by the word, the page or the book, or a pledge based on reading over the 3 week period. (It might get expensive if you sponsor our older bookworms by the word!)

You will see on the sponsor form the opportunity for the NSA to claim Gift Aid, if you are eligible. This increases the value of your donation by 25%.

The readathon lasts three weeks ending on the last day of the half term holiday - Monday 31st October.
