North Plays Important part in Child Anxiety Research

Our school's contribution to a major study into child anxiety has been recognised by the study's lead researcher, Tessa Reardon, who thanks us very much for taking part, commenting: "Without the support of children, parents and teachers this research would not be possible."

In all 58 families from North have taken part in the study. The research team will now get in touch with some of the participating families to invite you to take part in a more detailed assessment of your child's anxiety and to complete some further questionnaires.

A report based on information gathered from schools throughout the country will be produced and used to help professionals to have a better understanding of child anxiety and ways to help. Once the school has a copy of this report, we will let you know key findings.
