Robotics Challenge

The competition was in four parts: to code, using Scratch, the vehicle to travel a metre and stop; to control the car as it travelled over rough terrain; complete a maze puzzle (timed and as a race); travel 3 metres as fast as possible (timed race). This was our first time in the competition so we did not know what to expect. They had built a car that looked like a monster truck! Hari had brought in a bag full of wheels from home to test his theories. It worked really well on the rough terrain and they gained maximum points. But when it came to the race at the end and we were beaten by the smaller, lighter models.
