

## SAW TOUR -Governors Very Impressed

"How do your maths challenges work?"

"How does teachers' written feedback help you?"

These were just two of the key questions that four of our governors were asking our budding mathematicians when they visited the class rooms on the morning of Friday 16th for a School At Work (SAW) Tour. Mrs Blackwell, Mrs. Cook (pictured with Harry in Year 1), Miss Perkins and Mrs Javaid (pictured with Year 6) found the children polite and enthusiastic as always, keen to talk about their maths and to tell the governors how much they enjoyed this subject.

In the Foundation classes Governors found, "there is a strong emphasis on using practical teaching to give children a deep understanding of what they are learning," and that our youngest pupils, "were extremely articulate and able to explain their work."

In Year 1 and 2 Governors found children "were keen to show their maths folders, and explain the marking system in place which they liked and fully understood. They seemed happy with the purple polishing pen which gave them the opportunity to improve their work. Some children had feedback sessions which helped them to understand if they had gone wrong, and they all knew where to go or look if they needed help. Teachers moved the lessons smoothly on, whilst ensuring the less able were not left behind."

In Year 3 and 4 Governors found, "the children spoke knowledgeably about the marking system commenting that pink is good and that they've got it all right, with 'Green means you need to have another look at it to make it better.' It seems a great way to provide feedback to children, with them responding positively to it. Governors also "really liked the idea of the 'Tweet the teacher' system – a chance to give positive (or constructive) feedback to the teacher about their lesson/homework/challenges.

Year 5 and 6 told the governors about how confident they were about their Maths skills and most enjoyed doing Maths. "Some pupils might need some extra help with their maths work, if that is the case they have a weekly LSA session. They are explained the work and pupils found it quite helpful. Once they know then they are given a few weeks and then tested in their work again to know where their understanding is."

Owen (pictured holding up his new maths book) is new to North having started only two weeks ago. He says he is really liking it at North and he is enjoying the maths even though it is harder here than at his old school. I don't get every question right but I am doing well." Which is how it should be. If Owen got every answer correct then his teacher would not know what his limits are or how good his learning characteristics are when he does get stuck. The teachers try to get the balance right between building confidence and fluency and presenting work that requires deeper thinking and application.

#### Another Goodbye and A Hello and Welcome
