This year our appeal will help **Essex Integration**. This is a non-profit organisation that provides essential support services to newly arriving refugees and migrants accepted under the Home Office Vulnerable Persons Relocation scheme to live in Essex. This charity works on a contract basis for Essex County Council to deliver the core requirements of the scheme, it also provides, as a charitable trust, wider integration support through a range of voluntary and community services.

The children have been learning a song called, *When I needed a Neighbour* for our Harvest Festival on the 20th. They have also been told the parable of the Good Samaritan which sadly seems to have an even more powerful message in these troubled times. Essex Integration are very grateful for our support.

The children have been asked if they can bring in a gift to help turn houses into homes. Here are three ways in which our children can make a difference to newly arriving children and their families.

1.to donate one of their books.

- 2. to donate a board game (small one) that can be played by children and families.
- 3. to donate a toy for a child of a similar age.
