# **National Young Mathematicians' Award 2017**

Ira, Matthew, Toleen and Taabish were in agreement – that was their hardest maths challenge - ever. They had just finished competing in the first round of the NYMA in Sainsbury's Tollgate superstore. Explore Learning have a maths and English tuition centre in the store and they are running this competition in conjunction with NRich, a maths organisation based at Cambridge University. Alongside North was local school Hamilton Rd, a school from Suffolk and another school that had travelled down from Norfolk.

The winning team has to demonstrate more than just good mathematical thinking and accurate calculations; the four mathematicians are observed and judged on the effectiveness of their team work too. The team will find out in a few days time if they have made it through to the next round in Chelmsford.



On the 10th councillors from Bishop William Ward and Heathlands visited North to attend a Triad School Council Meeting. They were hosted by Will, Olivia, Neev and Lola (pictured above). This year the councillors will be working on a project to explore the impact of Visible Learning on the pupils in the three schools. Next term this exercise will be repeated in the other two schools.
