## **Roman Walk**

In KS1 the children have been learning about the Romans and about how the town of Colchester was very important to the Romans. Last week Mrs. Parker, a school governor and historian helped us with our learning by showing us evidence that the Romans were once in our town. She visited the Year 1 classes and showed them pictures of things that we can see around us that have been left by the Romans. She then led the Year 2 classes on a walk around the town to show them the evidence first-hand! We looked at things such as the Roman wall along Balkerne Hill, the gate-house at the top of the hill where soldiers would have stood guard watching the road which led to London, the remains of the Roman theatre in the Dutch Quarter. Mrs Parker also told us about jewellery found by archaeologists working on the renovation of Fenwicks that had been buried by Romans fleeing from the attack on Colchester by Boudicca.
