National Lottery support Home Coming Project to mark First World War Centenary

'Home Coming' is the final part of a trilogy of projects, continuing on from the highly successful 'We Will northwewillrememberthem@outlook.com. Remember Them' and 'Discovering Their Footsteps'. The Year 5 teachers and pupils will work with Historian Claire Driver and me to research and identify former pupils and staff. We will visit Colchester town centre to discover and evidence the urban heritage associated with WWI, to promote understanding of what Colchester was like one hundred years ago.

This trip will be the beginnings of a journey in making heritage relevant for the pupils, laying the initial foundations of understanding WWI and its impact on their society, inspiring them in taking the project forward.

The pupils will also visit Colchester Museum Services and Essex Record Office to use primary sources such as the school log book, photographs and maps to discover how an archivist works and gain understanding of how these sources can help them to find out about the former pupils and the history of Colchester in the aftermath of war. Pupils will have the opportunity to visit the Holly Trees Museum where objects, photographs, memorabilia and diaries from WWI are on display. The exhibits include the medals of Royal Reginald Gomer, who was a former pupil at North Primary School.

> 'Home Coming' will culminate on the centenary of the end of WWI, November 11th 2018, which is also the 124th anniversary of North Primary School opening, sharing the heritage at local commemorations.
