UNDERSTANDING E-SAFETY What do our children know?

Before the holiday Year 6 had two E-Safety workshops which they enjoyed very much. As you know all year groups are taught e-safety but we do more with year 6 because they are the most independent age group.

In the first workshop the children shared what devices they have and what they use them for. Time was spent considering what the benefits are and what the risks are for their various uses. Children raised a number of questions around safe use which were addressed in the second workshop.

What did we learn about our children from these workshops? Well, boys love gaming and more girls are gaming online now than in previous years. WhatsApp and snapchat are a very big parts of girls' social lives, but boys use these more than in previous years. Robolox is still the most popular game. 3 other most popular games are FIFA, Call of Duty and Minecraft.

It is fair to say that this year group are very confident users and know their way around their phones and tablets. They have greater awareness of risk than previous year groups. However, that does not mean that they always make good choices.

In the second workshop they taught each other how to report, block or remove people on a range of social media. It would appear that they do this a lot – mainly around friendship issues.

They were very clear that they would not always tell parents if they reported things – they were worried about what you might do. Teachers reinforced the message that children should talk to an adult they trust about such matters if they were concerned about their own or another's safety.

It is vital that children do feel that they can speak to parents about these matters without worrying their parents may "overreact". This is a conversation all parents should have with their children who have online activity.

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UNDERSTANDING E-SAFETY Parents - when should you start teaching your children?

Think of road safety. Would you let your children ride a bike on the road without teaching them how to ride it, what the rules of road safety are and how to use the brakes? Well, that is pretty much what we as parents are doing with children's social media and online activity usage. Most children are learning on the road as they go along. And this is not necessarily because we are not good parents making sure they are road safe before they set off. It is because these are new rules and we are learning them at the same time. In fact, many of our children are more confident users than we are. But confident does not always mean safe. We have probably all seen what can happen to over-confident cyclists.

To continue with the road safety analogy. As parents, we taught our children how to cross a road many years before we thought they were old enough to do it by themselves. This is how we should approach e-safety. When they are young, use devices together. Allow them to learn from you how to get the best from our technology. And also how to spend time without it being used. Children are inquisitive, listen to their questions, ask them what they think the answers are and then find out together. Be open with them. Then, if they do have a problem they are more likely to come to you for advice. Then as you become confident in their awareness and understanding you can trust them to be independent.
