Futsal arrives in Colchester

On Monday the 12th a group of 8 Year 3 and 4 girls were invited to attend a Female Futsal Festival at the University of Essex. The event was run in their brand new state of the art arena, which is home to the Essex Blades Basketball team and the Mavericks Netball team. There were 7 primary schools who attended this event and it was aimed specifically at girls who had limited experience of football. The festival was also promoting the Wildcats Football club which is being run at the University but also has satellite clubs within the Colchester area.

Futsal is an indoor version of football, pioneered in Brazil. Players like Neymar were brought up on Futsal. The afternoon started with a skills session where they went round 5 different activities that looked at dribbling, passing, small sided games and general agility. To finish the girls played a round robin tournament against the other schools that were present. The aim of the afternoon was all the participants to have fun and find out more about the game.
