# **Cycling to School**

You will have noticed bike racks have been installed at the front of the school and at the rear beside the NSA pavilion. We are very grateful to one of our parents, Peter Scopes, manager of the Red Lion Precinct who secured funding for the scooter and bike racks. Look out for the article soon to appear in the local paper.

For children to use the bike racks please abide by the following rules.

Children should only ride to school if parents are confident of their child's competence.

Helmets must be worn.

Bikes are stored at owners risk but must be locked. Children should dismount and walk into school - courtesy must be shown at all times to pedestrians.

On an organisational note, if a child stays to an after school club the bike should be parked at the front of the school. [The rear gates will locked.]

Please also note: scooters should not be ridden through the school grounds.
