He was a very welcome VIP guest in the award assembly where he presented the certificates. It was explained to the children that an MP is like a school councillor. 
Governor Corner

Thank you to everybody who signed the letter. Mrs. Blackwell presented the letter to Mr. Quince before they joined Governors from other schools to discuss the impact of underfunding and what we can do to change Government Policy.

Mr Quince is now clear that there is a massive problem. He spoke in favour of increases to schools funding in an education debate in Parliament on February 26th. At our meeting he agreed to help schools in Colchester petition the Government. He will draft a petition and has urged governors to get as many signatures as possible from parents in order to raise awareness of the issue, locally and nationally.

He made other pledges including to rally support among MPs from all parties to lobby for increased funding for education in the Comprehensive Spending Review, especially now that the Chancellor has an extra 17 billion to spend. Governors from all schools left feeling that Mr. Quince had listened and is committed to the cause. Watch this space. Juliette Maxam,
