On Friday 12th all Year 3 children went to Castle Park as part of their science learning. We began our day by going on a tree hunt. We looked at a variety of trees, trying to identify them by their leaves. As well as looking at common indigenous trees such as Oaks and Willows, there are many rare species of trees such as Indian Bean tree with its huge, silky leaves or Maidenhair tree, native to China and endangered in the wild. Children were fascinated by all of the interesting facts we discussed and loved the thrill of finding a new variety and taking small samples. As there are many ways of identifying trees, we looked at tree barks and had some fun taking tree rubbings. As each tree has its unique pattern, they all looked like pieces of art. We also measured around trees to try to calculate their age. As all trees grow at different rates, we used the average of 2cm to divide its girth by. We found an Oak over 200 years old in the Lower Castle Park. It took 5 of us to hold our hands to reach around it! To finish off



our day, we spent some time playing in the adventure playground. Great memories have been made during the trip. Thanks to the parents who joined us.
