Last week, a team of Governors held their twice-termly meeting to discuss curriculum at the school (other meetings discuss finance, premises and personnel). A little extract from the policy... Learning starts in the home. Talking, listening, playing games. Exploring the local area—the park, the woods, the seaside. Children are little apprentices, learning alongside their family members. As parents we model learning behaviours—cooking, making, fixing, tidying, reading. At school we build on these foundations and want to help you to continue to support and develop your child's social, emotional and academic development.
