SCHOOL COUNCIL LAUNCH PLASTIC FREE SCHOOL CAMPAIGN

Year 6 Councillors did a fantastic job of launching their campaign to be the greenest school council ever when they led assembly on the 10th. They explained to the children and staff that a big part of this would be to achieve *Plastic Free School* status. They explained how plastics cause so many problems in the environment including the sea, as is visible by the rubbish that washes up on beaches.

On the 11th the council were joined by Andy Hickman, chair of the NSA and Tesco executive, and Emily Harrup, advisor to the Borough Council (pictured right). Both talked about the work their organisations do to promote greener living. Andy encouraged the children by informing them that Tesco's plans have been driven by the number of letters they receive from children. Emily talked about traffic, transport trees and recycling.

Everybody was in agreement that the school community were already taking positive steps - the Disco and the KS1 Sensory Garden are two good examples. Andy and Emily suggested that the next thing the councillors need to do is write an action plan. So that is what they will do.

YEAR 6 SEE THE LIGHT!

Year six pupils have experienced some moments of discovery recently in their science lessons where they have been investigating light. Seeing an image appear on the screen of their pin-hole camera generated an enthusiastic discussion and they were then able to link this concept to the structure of the eye and how it worked. On the afternoon of the 7th, Cherri Farren, a member of staff from the science department at St Helena secondary school, brought a collection of LED torches to help them investigate the idea that white light can be broken down into different colours of the visible spectrum. Again, there were magical moments of discovery, when they realised that overlapping colours generated new colours, and this created an excited buzz of questions and hypotheses. Thank you to Cherri Farren for guiding their experiments and helping to inspire their thirst for science knowledge.
