If you look closely in the bottom right hand corner it tells you the name of the artist and when it was painted.

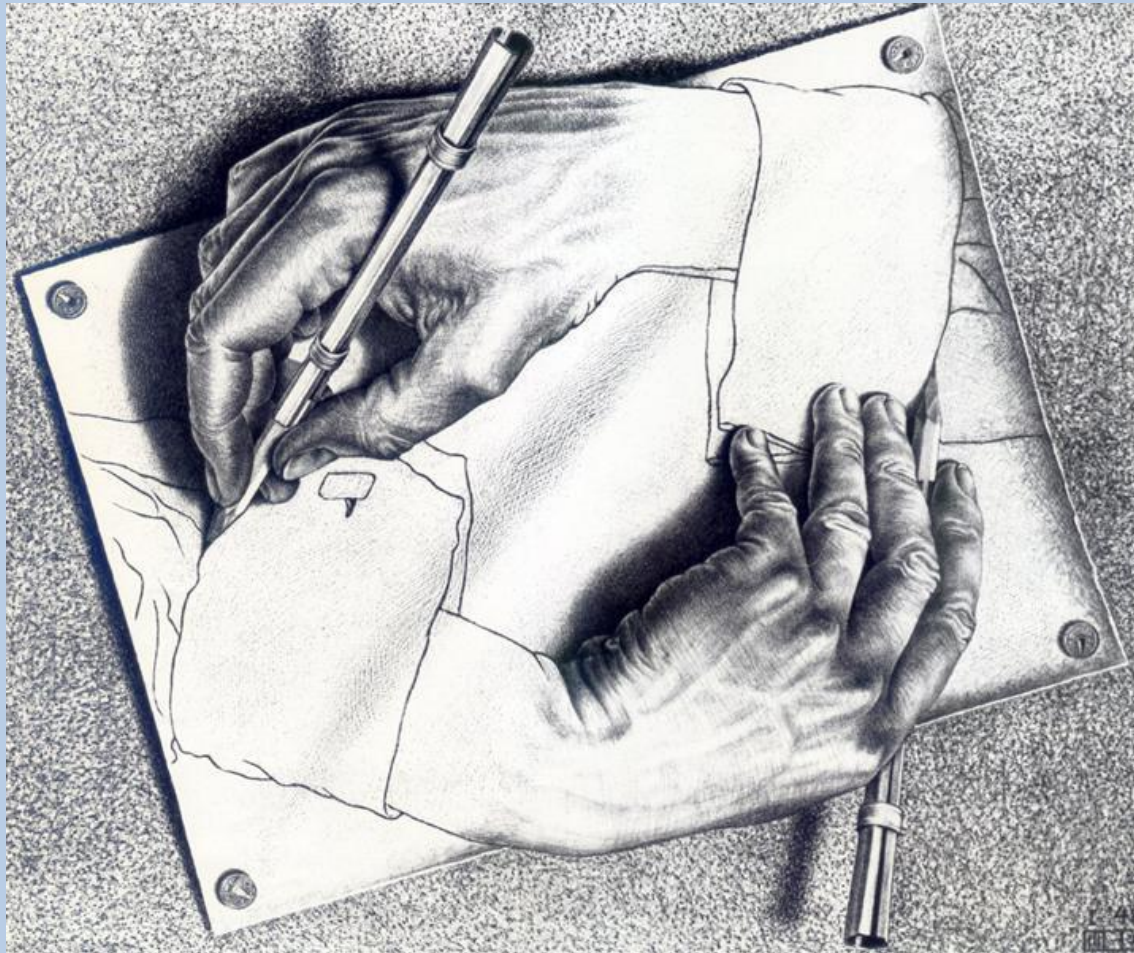




This watercolour, by Camille, is a view from Cudmore Grove, Mersea.

It is called L-Escargot.

Matisse turned to collage when he was very old and not strong enough to paint or make sculptures anymore.

L-escargot is the French word for snail. This is a collage of a snail

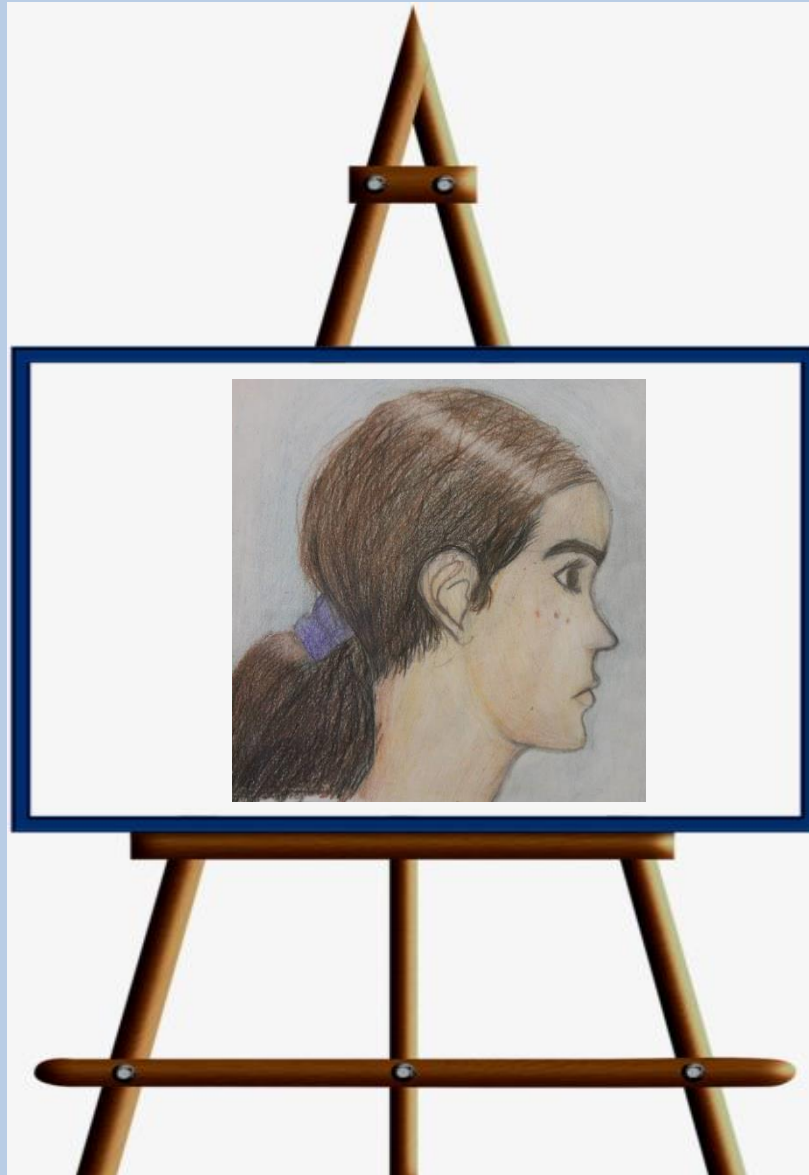
