Governor's Corner-Home Learning Survey

Thank you to all the parents who took the time to complete the short Home Learning survey sent out last term. The Governors found it useful to understand the parents' views, and we wanted to share some of the most prevalent points.

After everyone's efforts during our 'home-schooling' days, it was reassuring to see that:

- 95% of parents found it easy or very easy to access home learning via Tapestry and
- 85% of parents found it easy or very easy to access home learning via Seesaw.

We know that there are generally mixed feelings about the amount of home learning that children should receive in Primary schools or indeed, whether they should receive any at all. Schools have the unenviable task of negotiating a line through the middle of this debate, so it was reassuring that 87% of parents were happy with the level of home learning set for their child at North.

In an effort to reduce the school's carbon footprint (and printing costs!) the decision was made to avoid the blanket printing of newsletters and home learning. However, although online learning platforms clearly work brilliantly for some, the survey results showed a more even spread of preferences for the online platforms versus paper copies for home learning. We would like to remind you that if you would like to receive home learning in paper form, please speak to your child's class teacher, either in person or via Seesaw or Tapestry, and this can be arranged.

Once again, thank you for taking the time to respond to the survey and for any additional information that you gave us in the comments section. We hope you continue to enjoy the communication with teachers that these learning platforms seem to have provided and wish you a happy and healthy year ahead.
