Making North Station Road Safer to Cross

A school delegation met with local County Councillor, Lee Scordis, and MP Will Quince to listen to our concerns about driver behaviour on this road.

Barbara Gill, NSA, had been writing to Lee Scordis on this issue and made an impassioned case for the following –

- 1. Signage improvements so that drivers know they are approaching a school.
- 2. Timing on the crossing it is only red for short period.
- 3. Police to increase presence to capture speeding/ red light jumping.

Temporary signage installation – perhaps home made as a stop gap. During our time stood by the crossing we saw a number of vehicles going through the lights when red or setting off when the light was flashing and pedestrians were still crossing. Lee Scordis has got this response from Essex County Council –

The crossing in question is a pelican crossing which has a steady red man /green man for 5 seconds followed by the flashing amber/flashing green man for a further 8 seconds. These timings are fixed and cannot be adjusted. While the pedestrian is on the crossing, they have right of way.

Unfortunately ECC has no power of enforcement in relation to poor driver behaviour. This would be a matter for Essex Police who can be contacted via calling 101. Neither do ECC provide cameras for these purposes.

Going forward however, I am pleased to confirm that this site has been earmarked for an upgrade in the coming 12 months. When it does, the flashing amber/flashing green man period will be replaced with a vehicle red/green man followed by a vehicle red/pedestrian black out period, which is to be extendable, for improved safety to the pedestrian.

I am encouraged by the news of an "upgrade" but feel underwhelmed by the response to the request to change the timings. I have asked Cllr Scordis to push on this.

Will Quince's office have contacted my with this: "I want you to know that Will has raised concerns about speeding on North Station Road with the Police and First Buses, we will update you as soon as he receives a response."

As you will see, there are some lovely flags that sprung up on the road for the Jubilee. Apparently, it is not so straightforward to get signs put up to warn drivers that there will be lots of children.

For those of you following these developments there has been a rethink on the plan to limit traffic coming up North Station Road. That plan has been shelved.
