North School Choir Shine Like Diamonds

TV, newspaper photographers and Colchester Film Society were in attendance at the Arts Centre on Sunday 6th to capture the choir singing *Twinkle Twinkle Little Star*. The occasion was to promote Sir Bob Russell's campaign to get a statue made of the Taylor sister's – Ann and Jane - who lived in West Stockwell Stor Angel Strete as it was called at the turn of the 19th century. Jane wrote the Nursery Rhyme. A model ("maquette") of the statue has been made (see photo). £80,000 has been raised already. A further £20,000 is still needed.

The Arts Centre was full. The guests enjoyed listening to the choir - "Bless them, the children were just wonderful!" were the words of one of the guests. There was also a very informative talk about the Taylor sisters from The Colchester History Society and a film of Sir Bob's Heritage Tours. The Mayor gave a lovely speech too. The children got a slice of cake and drink as a well deserved "thank you".

If the funds are raised it is hoped the full-sized statue will be situated on the High Street, opposite the entrance to West Stockwell Street.
