## YEAR 3 HAVE BEEN TELLING THE SCHOOL ALL ABOUT THE ARCHIE PROJECT

In Good Learning Assembly on the 23rd, 3OM told the school all about the Archie Project which is a dementia awareness charity. The children were informed what dementia is and that it cannot be cured but it can be managed. With the help and knowledge of the disease and kindness from others, those with dementia can live an easier life. The two Y3 classes have visited Alderwood Care Home and met with residents who have memory loss or dementia. The children read to the residents, played games, drew pictures and asked questions about their lives. The children all had a fantastic time as you can see from the pictures.

Out of the blue Mr. Garnett received an email from a headteacher of a local school who wanted, "to just say thank you to North Primary. Some of your Y3s visited Alderwood Car Home, where my parents live. My mum has dementia, but my dad has all his faculties and he said what a wonderful group of young people they were and that they were a credit to the school. [My Dad] is a former secondary school headteacher and knows how important it is to recognize the hard work of staff in supporting young people to acquit themselves well in such circumstances. The visit was a high point in his day." What a lovely message.

One of the residents made the children promise to come back again and stay for at least 5 hours! Another lady said how wonderful it was to be around children and that they were so well behaved. And the photos really do show the joy of the residents and the children.

One of the managers at the Home wrote a lovely thank you letter which included the following - "It was just so wonderful to see the children and residents interacting, playing games, reading their books, drawing and asking so many questions... Dot (a resident) doesn't get involved but today she was full of beans and was chatting away."

The children had some lovely things to say as well. Here are some quotes.

Isaac 'I loved visiting the care home because the residents were really friendly and I liked reading to them.'

Gabriel 'We played rock, paper, scissors with them and noughts and crosses.'

Phoebe - 'I was really happy to go because I wanted to read my books to others.'

Emil 'I was so excited to read to an ex head teacher. He was very nice and helped me with words that I struggled with like Tutankhamun.'

Pola 'I enjoyed asking the residents questions and finding out about them.'

Tasneem 'The care home was really comfortable, calm and I was so excited to read.'

Railyn 'I was a bit nervous at first but then I realised they were quite fun and I wish I lived there.'
