






- There are 30 regional parks in Lithuania

Basketball Club Žalgiris is a professional basketball team that is based in Kaunas, Lithuania, and competes domestically in the Lietuvos krepsinio lyga (LKL, Lithuanian Basketball League). Founded in 1944, it is one of the oldest teams in the EuroLeague. Žalgiris is one of 11 European clubs to hold long-term licenses with the EuroLeague. The team is the most-decorated Lithuanian basketball club, having won 23 Lithuanian championships, 5 Soviet championships, 1 European championship.



Rūta Meilutytė (born 19 March 1997) is a Lithuanian swimmer. An Olympic gold medalist, she is a **world record holder** in the short course 50meter breaststroke and 100metre breaststroke. She is a former world record holder as well. At the age of 15, Meilutytė had already broken eleven <u>Lithuanian women's</u> swimming records.



The **Stelmužė Oak** is an <u>English (Pedunculate)</u> <u>oak</u> tree which grows in the former Stelmužė Manor park by <u>Stelmužė</u> village, Lithuania. The oak measures 3.5 m in diameter and 13 m in girth at its widest part; being 2.8 m. and 9.58 m at waist level. The oak reaches 23 m in height with only side branches remaining alive. *It is believed to be at least 1,500 years old, possibly, as much as 2,000 years old*; this makes it the oldest oak in Lithuania and one of the oldest in Europe. In 1960 the oak was declared a natural monument and included in the list of protected objects in Lithuania.



Užgavėnės (Pancake Day) takes place during the seventh week before Easter and is always celebrated on Tuesday. The celebration corresponds to holiday traditions in other parts of the world, such as Mardi Gras, Shrove Tuesday, Pancake day and Carnival.


A major element of the festival is the defeat of winter.
