## SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL

The traffic and parking situation is not getting easier. Our primary concern is that a child will get hit by a car. Our secondary concern is that there is an unsavoury incident between drivers, pedestrians and our neighbours.

Obviously we want all drivers to be patient and park responsibly and for parents to ensure their children are walking safely to school.

What else can be done? Well, to try and reduce the congestion along John Harper Street we will have a re-set - to the pre-covid route into school which is via the alleyway. So, the white gates will be locked.

In the morning this will mean the white gates locked at 8.25am. They will be unlocked at 8.50.

In the afternoon the white gates will be locked at 2.55pm and unlocked at 3.30pm.

N.B. The Victoria Chase entrance will remain open.

This change will be introduced on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> September. Please help to make it work.
