



INTRODUCTION





- Hong Kong located in southeast of China
- Hong Kong consists of Hong Kong Island, Kowloon and New Territories
- Hong Kong “香港” means Fragrant Harbor in Cantonese in 1800s
- Population: 7.4 million people
- Density: 17,311 people per square mile
- Weather: Subtropical climate
- Official language: Chinese and English (Cantonese in spoken form 96%)

Size of Hong Kong: 1,063 sq miles
= 0.7 London

China Ceded Hong Kong Island to Great Britain	Kowloon ceded to Great Britain	New Territories , together with 230 islands were leased from China for 99 years from 1898 to 1997	Sino-British Joint Declaration - GB will handover HK back to China in 1997	The whole territory was transferred from the United Kingdom to China	Chinese government stated that they consider the Joint Declaration to have ceased any legal effect after the transfer of sovereignty	Nearly two million Hong Kong people protest against a China extradition bill	The national security law was introduced in response to mass pro-democracy protests in Hong Kong


