Spain or España is one of the three countries in the iberian peninsula in western Europe.

Spain is divided into 17 autonomous communities which are further divided into 50 provinces



Spain's official languages

Spain has 4 official languages:

- Castilian (Castellano) which is the what the rest of the world calls Spanish
- Basque (Vasco) which is one of the oldest languages in the world.
- Galician (Gallego) is spoken in Galicia
- Catalan is spoken in Catalonia



Spanish

Spanish is spoken by over 500 million people and is the official language of over 50 countries. This makes Spanish the fourth most spoken language in the world.

Spanish is one of 44 romance languages which all evolved from Latin. For example French, Romanian and Italian.

Spanish alphabet has some different letter to the English one namely \tilde{n} pronounced "enye" taken from Latin which used to be a nn but was made into one letter around the 13th century.

In 2010 the letters ch (che) and II (elle) were removed from the Spanish alphabet

I has a population of 3.4 million. It is the second biggest in europe and Despite being a modern city it still keeps many of its historic streets untouched. Notable landmarks include




