We had another special visitor to the school on Monday 16th. Jean Quinn, pictured with Tamilore, attended the assembly for Y2-Y6 to launch a competition. Jean is a volunteer with Sustrans, the organisation that promotes sustainable transport, hence Sustrans. It was a very interactive assembly which the children very much enjoyed. The children were invited to consider the most exciting ways to travel to school-rockets and hot air balloons were two of the suggestions! Coming back down to earth we then thought about the healthiest ways to get to school-for our own health and the health of the planet. Then Jean asked the children if they had ever noticed lampposts with blue signs which have numbers in red. She explained that they mark out the way for cycle routes across the country. Finally, she got on to the main point of the assembly: competition time! The children have been invited to complete a colour design for the milepost which is next to the [damaged] weir at the bottom of Castle Park.
