Good afternoon, my name is Aniela and alongside me is my fellow school councillor, Sana. Today, we are talking about the community fruit basket. We will explain why this is a vital part of our school!

Upsettingly, some adults don't provide snacks for their children. Luckily, our fruit basket provides nutritious fruits that boost health benefits and energy levels, which helps students focus for sustained periods of time. Our community fruit basket is open to every individual in our school! We also have 4 excellent Fruit Monitors who always supply fruit for KS1. KS1 do not have to pay for their lunches, while KS2 have to pay.

One of the fabulous members of our school's association - Mrs Patrick - applied for the Tesco's Stronger Starts Grant to provide for our community fruit basket. In the end, we came 2nd in the blue token vote and won £1000 in September 2024. Our school spends £25 per week on 10 bags of fruit. That means we have 40 weeks to spend all of the £1000. Unfortunately, that means starting September 2025, people who can't manage to pay for food supplies will be focusing on how they have an empty stomach instead of focusing on their lessons.

To conclude, our community fruit basket is an essential and much loved part of our school.

Many students value what the community fruit basket represents: kindness, togetherness and wellbeing. We kindly request more funds for September 2025, for our community fruit basket to continue. Thank you for listening to our presentation!
