History On Our Doorstep

Colchester has been built around so much Roman history that we walk past it every day without taking the time to notice. All of the children in Years 5 and 6 decided to take the time to look when we went on a 'Roman Walk' around Colchester to find evidence of the Romans in our City. The walks were led by Claire Parker (pictured right), who is a local historian and a previous parent and governor of the school.

We started at the bottom of North Hill and found the remains of the gate which was one of the entrances into Roman Colchester. We then followed the Roman Wall up Balkerne Hill. The children were particularly interested in the way in which the wall was made and they noticed the use of tiles and stones. We also found evidence of a Roman theatre and a Roman Villa in the grounds of the Castle Park.

We are so lucky to have all of this history on our doorstep and we are vary grateful to Claire for sharing her knowledge of Roman Colchester with us.

SAVE OUR WEIR

Aniela, chair of the school council, welcomed a special guest to their meeting on the 19th. Mr. Tony Bland, father of a former pupil, was invited to address the council on his campaign to get the weir at the bottom of Castle Park repaired and the bridge to be reopened. Mr. Bland described what happened on December 10th 2023 and explained the impact of the bridge being closed on the local community.

It makes the routes in and out of Castle Park longer and less safe. A number of our families can no longer use that bridge on the walk to and from school, instead having to go along the path which is in a terrible state. The councillors came prepared with questions ranging from the history of the weir to the cost and logistics of the necessary repairs. He was also asked about how he was organising the campaign. He was very impressed with the councillors' questions, especially this one: What gave you the courage to start this campaign?
